

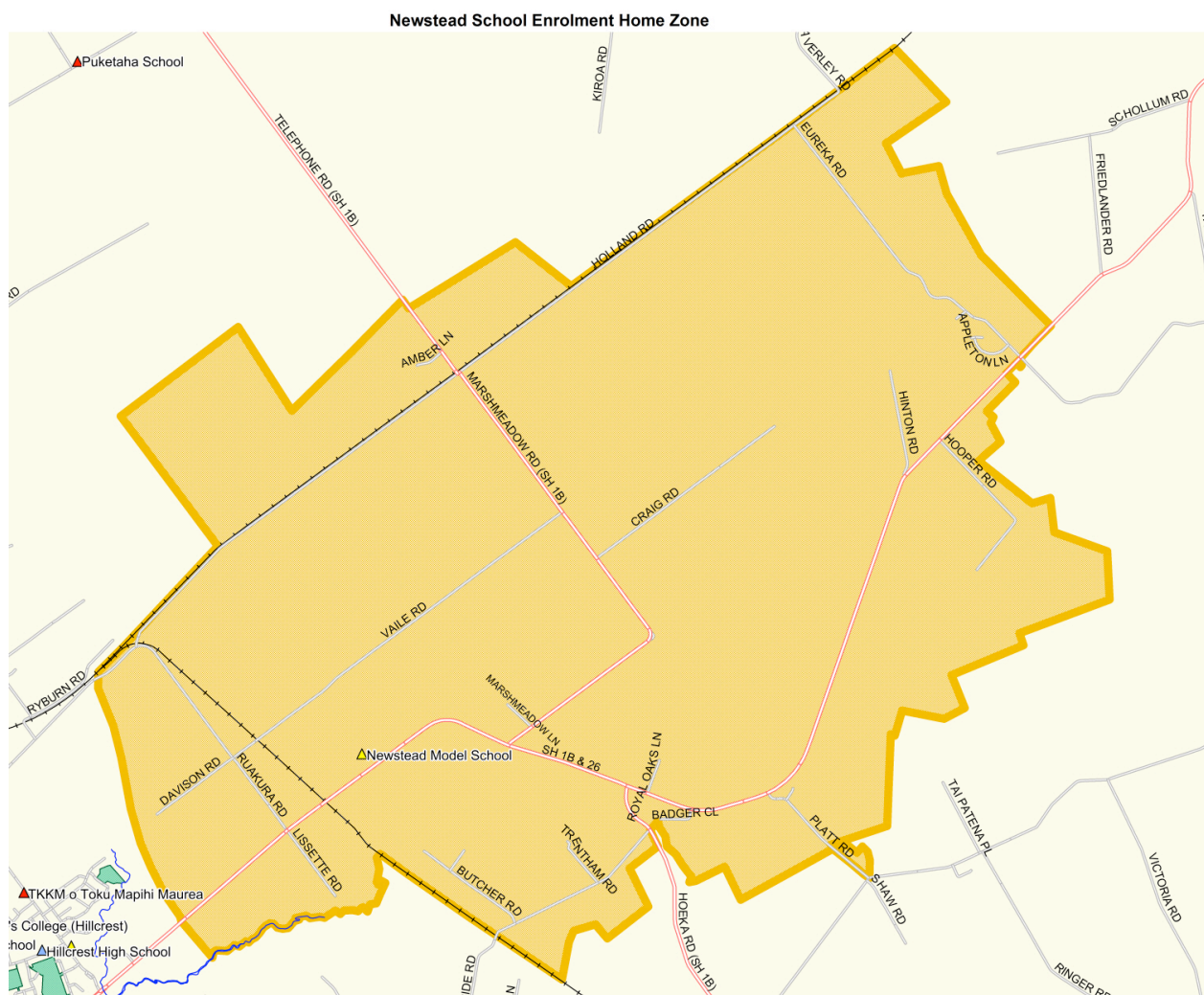


## ENROLMENT SCHEME

# NEWSTEAD MODEL PRIMARY SCHOOL

### Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone shown in Figure 1, below, and described overleaf, shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

Description of the boundary of Newstead Model Primary School Enrolment Scheme Home Zone

Start at the corner of Holland and Eureka Roads. The boundary runs south-east to the end of Eureka Road, at the intersection with State Highway 26 (SH26), to include all addresses on Eureka Road and the cul-de-sacs of Masters Road and Appleton Lane.

The boundary then tracks south down SH26, including Hooper Road, Oakview Place, Platt Road and Badger Close. Tauwhare Road and Shaw Road are excluded.

At the intersection with Hoeka Road (SH1B) follow Hoeka Road to the intersection with Woodside Road as far as the railway line. Addresses including and north of (greater than) 130 and 131 Woodside Road, and the adjoining cul-de-sacs of Trentham Road, Butcher Road and Bird Lane are within the zone.

The boundary follows the railway line north-west to the Mangaonua Stream and then follows the stream south of SH26, to a point in line with SH26 at 202 and 205 Morrinsville Road (SH26). Addresses on SH26 from 202 and 205, to 1298 and 1289, inclusive, are within the zone. Lissette Road is in zone.

From 205 Morrinsville Road (SH26), the boundary runs overland, west of Davison Road (included) and intersects Ruakura Road at number 352 so that address including and north of (greater than) 352 and 363 Ruakura Road are included.

The boundary then follows Holland Road, (Ryburn Road excluded) and includes Telephone Road to number 63 so that addresses including and south of (less than) 63 and 28 are within the boundary. All Holland Road and Amber Lane addresses are included. From Telephone Road, the boundary continues along Holland Road and arrives back at the starting point of the corner of Holland and Eureka Roads.

Proof of residence within the home zone may be required.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date which will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

## **Out of zone enrolments**

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

| <b>First Priority</b>  | (This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary)            |
| <b>Second Priority</b> | must be given to any applicant who is the sibling of a current student of the school.  |
| <b>Third Priority</b>  | must be given to any student who is the sibling of a former student of the school.   |
| <b>Fourth Priority</b> | must be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.   |
| <b>Fifth Priority</b>  | must be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school, or a child of a member of the board of the school. |
| <b>Sixth Priority</b>  | must be given to all other applicants.   |

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group must be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

**The Enrolment Scheme will come into effect from 1 May 2017.** All 'out-of-zone' students seeking enrolment in the school from 1 May 2017 will therefore be subject to the scheme criteria.
