# Cricket Report

## Game 1 vs Hamilton Old Boys Scorpions

The Red Hawks played the Scorpions at Jansen Park and elected to bat after winning the toss. Xander batting at the top of the order struck two superb boundaries, while later in the innings Amelia and Kurt took full toll of several wide deliveries to combine in a partnership of 32. All the batsmen combined well with the other partnerships adding at least 20 runs to see the Red Hawks through to a score of 95/5 from their 12 overs (Xander 14, Pippi 8, Isla 6, Zoe 14, Kurt 14, Amelia 18, Jamie 10 and Sophia 11).

The Red Hawk's started well with the bowlers and fielders making scoring difficult for the Scorpion batsmen picking up wickets at regular intervals. With the match in the balance Jeremy from the Scorpions played a superb innings striking the ball to all parts of the ground scoring 25 runs, he was well supported by his partners and the final partnership added 51 runs to see the Scorpions post a score of 133/9. Xander (3), Kurt (2) and Isla (2) led the team in the field effecting 7 run outs between them. Kurt and Jamie led the bowling performance with Jamie and Xander clean bowling batsmen. Xander (2), Isla (2), Sophia (2), Kurt (2) and Jamie claimed wickets.

During this season's competition a team loses 5 runs for each wicket they lose; therefore, the final scores were Red Hawks 70 and the Scorpions 88, a win to the Scorpions by 18 runs. Amelia, Isla and Xander were named players of the day; Amelia for her superb batting showing great strength in her shots and having the ability to turn ones into twos; and to Isla and Xander for their all-round performances, picking up wickets with the ball and effecting several run outs, and their batting, Xander for his ability to hit the ball and Isla for batting well against strong, accurate bowlers. ## Game 2 vs Tamahere Volts

The Red Hawk's returned to Jansen Park to take on their country neighbours the Tamahere Volts and batted first after winning the toss. The game started sensationally with Chloe claiming a wicket clean bowled off the first ball of the match. The Volts team made scoring difficult through a combination of fast accurate bowling and very good fielding which led to several run outs. Ashley and Isla had the highest partnership of the innings adding 27 runs while Xander and Carter added 24 runs to close the innings out. Charlotte, Sophia, Harrison and Amelia all batted very well against the big fast pace bowler, managing to score singles regularly. Xander closed the innings out in style with a couple of well-placed boundaries with the team score of 102/10. (Charlotte 9, Sophia 8, Ashley 14, Isla 13, Eden 11, Jamie 9, Harrison 6, Amelia 8, Xander 18 and Carter 6).

At the innings break the team was challenged to field as effectively as the Volts team had, and the team stepped up with several players excelling in the field. Xander (3), Harrison (2), Isla (2), Jamie and Ashley all effected run outs, while Eden and Sophia claimed wickets clean bowled. Jamie (3), Sophia (2), Eden (2), Harrison (2), Ashley and Isla claimed wickets. Like the previous week the result of the match was in the balance as the last pair arrived to bat with the Volts requiring 24 runs from 3 overs. With their most accomplished batsmen about to bat the game was there for the taking. Charlotte bowled a very tight over conceding just 3 runs leaving 21 runs needed from 2 overs. The Volts batsman Reed struck 3 boundaries but crucially Sophia was able to take a wicket to ensure a tense last over. Reed then appeared to have the match won for the Volts striking a four and a massive six off the first three balls, but a wicket late in the over meant three runs were needed from the final ball.

Eventually the match concluded with the Volts only able to score a single to end on 106/11 from their 12 overs. The Volts batsmen could look back on several missed opportunities to take a second run, something the Red Hawks did well. Final scores were the Red Hawk's 52 and the Volts 51, a win to the Red Hawk's by 1 run. Harrison, Jamie and Eden were named

Players of the Day, Harrison for the improvement shown in the field, effecting two runouts, claiming his best bowling figures of 2/9 and for his performance with the bat against some hostile bowling. Jamie for another strong bowling performance claiming 3 wickets and especially for having the courage to use her run up for the first time. To Eden who competed extremely well in her first game of cricket, scoring 11 runs, taking two wickets in a very economical over and making several stops in the field. Captain Eden

## Registration for School Soccer

TERM 2 and part of TERM 3 2021

It's that time of year again!

Soccer season is about to start again - 1st match on Sat 8th May.



The Waikato Soccer Association (WaiBOP) will be continuing to have single sex teams from U7 upwards. i.e. girl's teams and boy's teams. This is to improve player development and confidence with the game.

Junior Football: for boys and girls born 2008 - 2014. Games are Saturday mornings on a home and away basis, hopefully at least half at Newstead, half at other fields in Hamilton or greater Waikato. If we do not have enough team members to form a single sex team then we will have to field mixed teams into the boy's league.

First Kicks: for boys and girls born 2015-2017 soccer is not affected and will continue to be mixed sex teams. Games for First Kicks are Saturday mornings 9am at Galloway Park. This consists of skill activities and 3 10min 4x4 mini games.

We are hoping to have teams in each year group as we have done in the past, but if we do not have enough children to form a team then your child might **either** have to play in a different grade, in a mixed team **OR** have to play for the Hillcrest United Soccer club, based at Janssen park, or Claudeland Rovers Soccer club, based at Galloway Park.

We need to have an **early** idea of how many children will be playing soccer this year in order to put the teams together as quickly as possible. **Can all parents please get forms in by the 1st March at the latest please.** Teams have to be registered before the end of term 1.

*We are aiming to keep the subs at **\$55/player** this year but will confirm once numbers are through.*



- \* Fee: \$50

Junior Football: for boys and girls born 2008 - 2014.

- \* Boys and girls are in separate leagues.
- \* Football grade determined by year of birth - your grade is the age you turn during the year. Boys teams are single grade, 7-13, Girls teams are mixed grade - 7/8, 9/10, 11/12/13. We try to group kids with friends where possible.
- \* Training after school once a week, generally at Jansen Park but can be at a school if you have a team mainly from one school.
- \* Games are Saturday mornings on a home and away basis, with half the games at Jansen Park, half at other fields in Hamilton or greater Waikato.
- \* A uniform (shirt and shorts) is provided, players must have their own black socks, shinpads (compulsory) and football boots.
- \* Register by the 26th March to guarantee a place in a team - after then, new registrations only accepted if space is available. See <http://www.hillcrestunited.co.nz/register> for how to register.
- \* Fees: if paid before 1 May: \$90 one child/\$150 two children/\$180 three children (in same family)  
if paid after 1 May: \$100 one child/\$170 two children/\$210 three children (in same family)
