Dear Parents and Whanau,

The Red Hawks won the toss for the fifth time and elected to bowl firs. In hot conditions, and with three rather weary players having been at camp, the team was challenged to lift their own performance in the field. And everyone rose to the challenge, fielding superbly with several complimentary compliments coming from the opposing teams' spectators. Ashley made several stops early on to set the standard in the field followed up by Amelia who completed the team's first stumping of the season, and later affected her first runout; Kurt (2) and Jamie also affected run outs. Xander and Kurt bowled very economically going for 2 and 3 runs per over respectively. Bowlers to take wickets were Kurt (2), Jamie (2), Ashley, Amelia, Xander and Charlotte with Kurt (2), Amelia and Jamie all hitting the stumps. The strength of the Kiwi team was their bowling and most of the Red Hawks batsmen found scoring difficult with several balls threatening the wickets. However, partnerships of 26 and 23, firstly between Charlotte and Kurt followed by Xander and Ashley helped the Red Hawks post a score of 83/4 from their 12 overs.

There were some special shots played by several batsmen, especially Eden, Carter and Charlotte who between them hit several straight drives. Amelia 7, Eden 10, Charlotte 14, Kurt 12, Carter 10, Jamie 7, Xander 13 and Ashley 10. Mack for his great sportsmanship, playing for the opposition, scoring 3 runs against some very accurate bowling and his enthusiastic fielding; Ashley for her strong fielding performance as well as her improved batting; Kurt for a fine performance in the field leading the team chasing the ball, to affect two run outs and his bowling figures of 2/6 from 2 overs; Eden for her improved batting, striking a superb cover drive in her innings of 10 and economical bowling; Jamie for her bowling, claiming 2/5 as well as the continued improvement with her ball striking. 

NEWS FROM YOUR WAIKATO DISTRICT COUNCILLOR - 18 FEBRUARY 2021

Councillors returned to meetings at the beginning of February and the main focus this month has been briefings from staff around the **Long Term Plan** (LTP). The LTP sets out our vision, direction, work plan and budgets for the next 10 years and outlines how our activities and services will be managed, delivered and funded.. With input from our communities, we develop a new LTP every three years – we currently refer to the 2018-2028 LTP and will adopt the 2021-2031 LTP in June 2021. As usual it is not easy to balance the budgets; however we are making good progress in our discussions.

To follow the process go to the web page <u>https://shape.waikatodistrict.govt.nz/ltp</u> The formal consultation process around the LTP will open 7 April and close on 7 May.

*The **District Plan process continues**. We should start to see the decisions on zoning coming out from July onwards. For those of you who are affected by the Tainui proposal I suggest you look on Council's website from July for the decision around this. However as soon as I have the information I will put it in my newsletter.

***Te Huia**, the new passenger rail service launches on Tuesday 6th April. All stations are completed, with public open days on 27th and 28th March. For more information about the confirmed timetable and fares go to <u>www.tehuiatrain.co.nz</u>



*I have previously mentioned that **property revaluation** advice would be received this month. However due to population growth in the Waikato district the valuers are experiencing delays in accurate data collection. Letters will now be sent out in March; date still to be confirmed.

*Construction of the three remaining sections of the Cambridge to Hamilton **Te Awa River Ride** has started, including an underpass on State Highway 21, Airport Road and the \$2.5 million Mangaonua Gully section, which includes over 350 m of elevated boardwalk through the gully, associated earthworks, retaining walls and landscaping. The project is jointly funded by Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency, and the Government's COVID-19 Response and Recovery Fund. Work was expected to begin on the eight-month build by the end of January, with completion earmarked for September 2021.



Once completed, the full Te Awa River Ride cycleway will span 60km from Ngaruawahia, through Hamilton and Cambridge, finishing up at Horahora, south of Lake Karapiro.
