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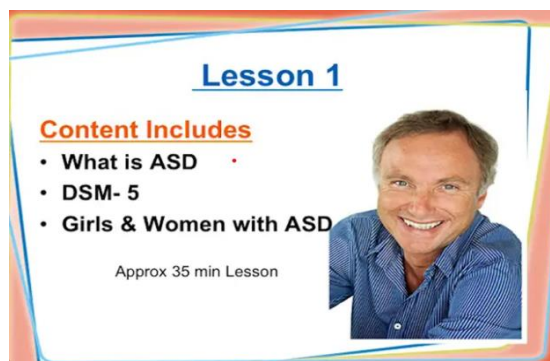

Game 7 vs Matangi School

The Red Hawks travelled to Matangi for the final game of the season and found themselves batting first after losing their first toss of the season. The Matangi bowling attack had some fast bowlers but they often lacked accuracy which allowed the Red Hawks batsmen to score regularly. The feature of the innings was the batsmen's ability to find the gaps and turn ones into twos with the team scoring nine twos to complement six boundaries hit by Amelia (2), Xander, Isla, Sophia and Kurt. Sophia and Jamie combined to add 23 runs, while the pairs of Xander and Isla, and Amelia and Charlotte added 19 runs. The innings closed with the score at 103/3 from 12 overs. Xander 7, Isla 12, Eden 8, Ashley 2, Sophia 13, Jamie 10, Charlotte 15, Carter 8, Kurt 9, Harrison 3 and Amelia 16.

Having not been at their best the previous game the challenge was laid down to the team to put in their best fielding performance of the season and the team certainly lifted their game, and they needed to with several of the Matangi batsmen showing the ability to hit the ball very hard and to the boundary often. The Red Hawk's bowlers responded well and stuck to the task, bowling with very good accuracy despite good balls being hit. The Matangi innings featured twelve boundaries, but equally as important, the Red Hawks were able to restrict the batsmen to just one two in the entire innings. The game was headed for a tight finish with the score 66/0 with 3 overs remaining, Charlotte then effected a run out off her own bowling before Carter claimed a vital wicket clean bowled with the first ball of the final over. The match went right to the wire with all results possible as the last ball of the match was bowled. With a single scored the innings closed with the score 97/2.

Final scores Newstead 88 and Matangi 87, and for the second time this season Newstead had claimed a one run victory. The key to the victory being the accuracy of the Newstead bowlers, bowling 11 wides compared to Matangi's 26 and the ability of the batsmen to turn ones into twos. Charlotte, Isla and Carter were named players of the day. Charlotte for the continued all round improvement in her game, making her highest score and making a vital stop in the field when a boundary looked certain to be scored; Isla for her improved striking of the ball with bat in hand and her improved bowling and Carter for her improved bowling, claiming a wicket clean bowled and her ability to hit good balls when batting. 
