We'll be ready as a whole staff to implement the programme fully across Newstead School in 2025.

Mitey is owned and run by the Sir John Kirwan Foundation, a New Zealand registered charitable trust.




# **BECOMING MITEY**


As a result of the themes highlighted in our production, we also have a focus in classes on Nursery Rhymes and Fairytales this term.


**ATTENDANCE UPDATE:** Although we currently are in the depths of winter sicknesses our school is doing well with our attendance rates this year. We appreciate you prioritising education for your child(ren) and sending them to school on time everyday. To help the whole school community maintain good health and attendance, we also appreciate you keeping your child(ren) home when they are sick.

In April 2024, the Government announced a regular attendance target of 80 percent of students to be present for more than 90% of the term by 2030.

Four **Student Attendance Categories** have been developed to help schools understand how frequently each student attends. These categories give you a way to monitor the progress you are making in supporting students to attend regularly.

<b>Student Categories</b>	Student with	Equivalent to
Regular attendance	over 90% attendance	missing fewer than 5 days across a term
Irregular absence	more than 80% and up to 90% attendance	absent for between 5 and 9 days across a term
Moderate absence	more than 70% and up to 80% attendance	absent for between 10 and 14.5 days across a term
Chronic absence	70% attendance or less	absent for 15 days or more across a school term

- Testing if you have COVID-19 symptoms, reporting the result and isolating.
- Having a care plan ready for if you get sick including any support from whānau and friends.
- Having the necessary medicines and cold and flu supplies at home.

- 1) All calves MUST have a NAIT tag in RIGHT ear
- 2) All calves to have an "<u>Animal Status Declaration Form</u>" when entering school grounds. The NAIT no. must be the number allotted to the property that the calf leaves from on show day
- 3) Calf/Student and supporters to pass through a Biosecurity pathway when entering calf show area.



# Let's talk about dogs and library services!

**Dogs** - A friendly reminder that annual dog registrations are due. Learn about how you can keep your dog registration costs down if you desex your dog and apply for a select dog owner classification (if you meet the criteria) – for details go to www.waikatodistrict.govt.nz/dogs.

**Library services** – membership is free for anyone living in Waikato District and it provides more services than you might realise, such as online resources including eBooks and eNewspapers, movies and documentary streaming, online learning and more. The Council library service also hosts a Seed Library, and holds collections of DVDs, and a range of kits for borrowing from music kits to tool kits.

Free access to City and regional libraries – under agreements with other Councils, all Waikato district residents have free access to libraries in Waipa (Cambridge and Te Awamutu) and Hauraki (Ngaatea, Paeroa and Waihi), and those living close to Hamilton (including everyone in Tamahere-Woodlands Ward) can join Hamilton City libraries for free by taking personal ID and proof of address to any City library.
